such jurisdiction as provided by law, and we will make 1 that corresponding change without discussion throughout 2 the Article. It appears many times. Any further question? 3 All right, Paragraph B, Page 17. 4 MR. MARTINEAU: This provides the composition 5 of the Appellate Court. The Appellate Court shall be 6 composed of a Chief Judge and no fewer than four associate 7 judges, as provided by law. The Appellate Court may sit 8 in panels of no fewer than three judges, as provided by 9 10 rule. Here, of course, we're running into the same 11 problem we just had a vote on, except I think there is 12 more reason here to have the three judges rather than a 13 higher number because we contemplate that there will be 14 many panels of this court sitting throughout the State and 15 we don't think that a panel should necessarily be any more 16 17 than three. We can envision a three judge panel and, of 18
