

1 We will move on then --

2 MR. CASE: I might say, Mr. Chairman, I will
3 go along with this, but I can warn the Commission that
4 this is a very unpopular provision, with respect to having
5 the court sit in panels, in some areas and you will find
6 when this gets into the convention that this probably
7 isn't going to survive.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Except there is one difference
9 between your situation, as I understand it. You were
10 talking about the enabling act, and that is a provision
11 of the Legislature.

12 MR. CASE: Yes.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: This is a provision in the
14 Constitution which leaves this situation to the Legislature
15 as to whether they can sit in panels.

16 MR. CASE: That's right. We didn't put anything
17 in the Constitution.

18 THE CHAIRMAN: I'm sorry, it's provided by rule.
19 Any further comment on Paragraph B? If not, we will move
20 to Section 4-A, on Page 18.
