We will move on then --1 MR. CASE: I might say, Mr. Chairman, I will 2 go along with this, but I can warn the Commission that 3 this is a very unpopular provision, with respect to having 4 the court sit in panels, in some areas and you will find 5 when this gets into the convention that this probably 6 isn't going to survive. 7 THE CHAIRMAN: Except there is one difference 8 between your situation, as I understand it. You were 9 talking about the enabling act, and that is a provision 10 of the Legislature. 11 MR. CASE: Yes. 12 THE CHAIRMAN: This is a provision in the 13 Constitution which leaves this situation to the Legislature 14 as to whether they can sit in panels. 15 MR. CASE: That's right. We didn't put anything 16 in the Constitution. 17 I'm sorry, it's provided by rule. THE CHAIRMAN: 18 Any further comment on Paragraph B? If not, we will move 19 to Section 4-A, on Page 18. 20 MR.
