giving that county a judge to take care of the judicial business in that court.

MR. MILLER: My point is that you say there must be an associate judge in each county.

THE CHAIRMAN: He's not talking about the question of language. It's the question of principle.

Mr. Sykes?

MR. SYKES: That doesn't accord with my recollection or the printed comments. My understanding was that the Superior Court was a State-wide court and it was going to have a Chief Judge who was responsible to the Chief Justice and this this Chief Judge was going to be essentially an administrative judge with State-wide functions and making him a resident of some county and saying that you didn't have to have at least one other judge who was resident in that county would take away from that county the advantages of a resident judge, and I think the Committee meant exactly what it said.

It should have a comma after the word judge; the Superior Court shall be composed of a Chief Judge, and it makes no difference where that judge resides, but in
