

1 MR. CASE: Then Mr. Sykes' interpretation is  
2 incorrect.

3 MR. SYKES: I must have been asleep. I thought  
4 it was the other way.

5 MR. CASE: I think he's right in substance.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Any other questions? Did you  
7 want to make a motion, Mr. Sykes?

8 MR. SYKES: Well, I move that the matter be  
9 recommitted to the Committee. I don't think we ought to  
10 debate it at length here, but I would like to get a chance  
11 to think about it and express my views in the Committee  
12 debate. It apparently was decided before I got there and  
13 the difficulty I have is if I thought it meant, from reading  
14 the language, something so clearly different from what it  
15 was intending, the Committee has a drafting job to make  
16 it clear as to what the resolution is.

17 MR. CASE: I second that motion, in that  
18 apparently there is some misunderstanding between the  
19 members of the Committee themselves as to what is intended.  
20 I personally am in favor of what Mr. Sykes has expressed  
21 and I think the Committee ought to thrash this out again.
