Then Mr. Sykes' interpretation is MR. CASE: 1 incorrect. 2 I must have been asleep. I thought MR. SYKES: 3 it was the other way. 4 I think he's right in substance. MR. CASE: 5 THE CHAIRMAN: Any other questions? Did you 6 want to make a motion, Mr. Sykes? 7 Well, I move that the matter be MR. SYKES: 8 recommitted to the Committee. I don't think we ought to 9 debate it at length here, but I would like to get a chance 10 to think about it and express my views in the Committee 11 debate. It apparently was decided before I got there and 12 the difficulty I have is if I thought it meant, from reading 13 the language, something so clearly different from what it 14 was intending, the Committee has a drafting job to make 15 it clear as to what the resolution is. 16 I second that motion, in that MR. CASE: 17 apparently there is some misunderstanding between the 18 members of the Committee themselves as to what is intended. 19 I personally am in favor of what Mr. Sykes has expressed 20

and I think the Committee ought to thrash this our again.
