we cannot delete the requirement that the jurisdiction be uniform, with the hope that the development of the enabling legislation will be such as to aim toward uniformity, but not to require it in the Constitution:

MR. MARTINEAU: I think the reason against that is that the experience in this State has been that the Legislature doesn't seek uniformity. Unless you require

it, you are not going to have it, and my honest personal feeling is, and I thought it was the opinion of the Committee, that the purpose of uniformity, the objective of uniformity was important enough to write this requirement into the Constitution.

MR. SAYRE: I thought the Committee had been

unanimous on the uniformity of jurisdiction of this court and, to me, if it didn't require uniformity, you are tossing it right back to what the present system we have now is, to almost have different courts for different jurisdictions, and that is what you want to eliminate.

You want to know what court is going to handle

what jurisdiction.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sykes?
