District Court would be the floor of the uniform jurisdiction of the Superior Court.

MR. RODOWSKY: Right.

THE CHAIRMAN: And, therefore, even though you may vary the ceiling of the concurrent jurisdiction, you are not varying the jurisdiction of the Superior Court.

MR. RODOWSKY: Right. I understood Mr. Bond to say he would go a step beyond all the prior discussion and even vary the exclusive.

MR. BOND: No, sir. My position is exactly that of the Maryland Bar Association.

MR. HARGROVE: Mr. Chairman, I think we have

somewhat lost track of what jurisdiction this court will have. I think we also have to consider that there will be criminal jurisdiction as well as jurisdiction in traffic cases. I think we have been talking more in terms of civil litigation.

Now, those who go into the various courts throughout the counties know that the criminal jurisdiction varies throughout, from county to county, and I think it would be better to have a uniform jurisdiction in that
