2 I am familiar with the civil practice, having
3 served in one of those courts, but I am not persuaded
4 one way or another. I think in Baltimore City there
5 might be some difficulty, although I feel it really
6 doesn't make any difference; but, as far as the criminal,
7 the traffic jurisdiction, I would hate to see manslaughter
8 cases being tried in a District Court in one place and in
9 a Superior Court in another, because it is that important.
10 I think we need uniformity in this area.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

12 MR. BOND: Mr. Chairman, I would like to ask
13 this one question of the Committee. Does this language
14 reflect the position of the Maryland State Bar Association,
15 as set forth by Mr. Case?

16 MR. MARTINEAU: No, I don't believe it does.

17 MR. BOND: It does not?

18 MR. MARTINEAU: It arises, it seems to me,
19 under two completely different situations. It is not
20 analogous. I don't think the State Bar is considering
21 the same thing we are here.
