THE CHAIRMAN: I want to make one comment and
that is to remind the Commission of the efforts the Com-
mission is trying to make to use every possible device
to upgrade the District Court.
MR. CLACETT: Mr. Chairman, what happens
insofar as your right of appeal? In other words, let's
assume for the moment that the exclusive jurisdiction is
\$1,000. Then what provision or what would be your right
of appeal from an adverse verdict in a case?
THE CHAIRMAN: Whatever was provided by law.
The fact that the District Court had exclusive jurisdiction
would not mean there was no right of appeal.
MR. CLAGETT: So, in effect, then the trial
de novo has been done away with?
THE CHAIRMAN: I don't follow you.
MR. MARTINEAU: That isn't dealt with here at
all.
MR. CLAGETT: Wouldn't it have the effect of
doing away with trial de novo, because it would be pro-
vided otherwise by rule?
THE CHAIRMAN: You mean trial de novo, on appeal
