would be giving to the Superior Court a jurisdiction 1 concurrent with the exclusive jurisdiction which you have given to the District Court. 3 THE CHAIRMAN: I would personally doubt that that would preclude the Legislature from authorizing a 5 trial de novo on appeal. MR. CLAGETT: Then, Mr. Chairman, the point is it wouldn't be exclusive. 8 MR. MARTINEAU: I think it would be there first. THE CHAIRMAN: I think the extent to which the 10 11 Legislature permits an Appellate Court to review is entirely within the discretion of the Legislature, and I 12 do not think that in any way affects the jurisdiction of 13 14 the nisi prius court. BURDETTE: Don't you need the expression, 15 the court of original jurisdiction? 16 THE CHAIRMAN: You might. 17 DR. BURDETTE: As a non-lawyer, I wouldn't know. 18 Any further questions? 19 THE CHAIRMAN: MR. SAYRE: If I understand this right, by 20 21 inserting the word exclusive, you are limiting the scope
