So that, if I follow you then, THE CHAIRMAN: what you are saying is if the Legislature in dealing with concurrent jurisdiction wanted to make it other than uniform, it would have to do so on the basis of classification permitted by the Constitution and not on the individual county basis.

MR. CLAGETT: That is correct.

MRS. BOTHE: Would that mean then that this phrase is unnecessary, because the Legislature couldn't vary the jurisdiction?

THE CHAIRMAN: No. It would mean that if the Legislature said that it would divide the counties of less than 100,000 in Class 1 and those with a population of less than half a million in Class 2, we could provide concurrent jurisdiction in counties of under a hundred thousand, and so on.

I would like to make a comment, MRS. BOTHE: and I raised this point originally. As much as I might sound to the contrary, I am going to vote against the
