Our Committee considered the matter and concluded that the Judiciary should be able to prepare its own budget and to have it submitted to the Legislature without the Executive changing it, being of course, subject to being cut by the Legislature whenever it was deemed proper. We are not convinced as to the necessity of including this particular language in the Article on the Judiciary. It might better be included in the Section of the budget.

However, we do feel that the idea is important and should be included either in this Article or in the Section on the budget.

> Mr. Bond? THE CHAIRMAN:

MR. BOND: The Committee on Finance and Taxation did consider the question at a meeting last week. Dr. Jenkins and Senator Hoff and myself and Mr. Case were present. We did come to a definite conclusion that the salaries of the judges should not be subject to any change, but it was Mr. Case's view, concurred in by the Committee, that some of the administrative expenses of the courts should be subject to scrutiny of the Governor.
