where the Governor now does exercise control over the budget of the Judiciary Department, and whether or not this is proper, I don't know. I do know that the chief judge of the court and his administrative office is extremely unhappy over the control that the Executive has over the budget. They have never made an issue of it. They have always submitted to that control. We, of course, as our suggestion indicates, feel that this control is not proper, and I believe this is the unanimous view of our Committee.

MR. BOND: Mr. Chairman, I would move this matter be deferred until we get the Committee Report from the Committee on Taxation and Finance which is in the process of preparation now.

THE CHAIRMAN: I certainly think that we ought to defer consideration until we have it before us, the Report of the Committee on State Finance with respect to the budget which will be available next week. Is there a second?

MR. GENTRY: Second.
