l I may.

The State shall be divided by law into circuits of the Supreme Court and into circuits of the Appellate Court. To be eligible for nomination and appointment to the Supreme Court or to the Appellate Court, a person shall reside in the circuit where the vacancy exists.

To be eligible for nomination and appointment to the Superior Court or to the District Court, a person shall be a resident of the county or district, respectively, where the vacancy exists.

MR. MARTINEAU: Now, when we left this yesterday, there was a motion under discussion.

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, to amend the first paragraph, Paragraph A, to require for eligibility that the person be a resident of the State and to eliminate the second and third paragraphs. I think that was Mrs. Bothe's motion. We were discussing at that time, and my recollection is that Mr. Miller had the floor, and I cut him off. Did you want to resume now, Mr. Miller?

MR. MILLER: I don't think so at this time.
