point in the Report yet, but you will see when we do, 1 the trial court nominating commissions which will be dis-2 tricted by law will each have the responsibility for 3 selecting a judge within their particular district, so 4 I think the odds are quite remote that a trial court 5 nominating commission would select a Superior or Circuit 6 Court judge from outside the area, that is that they are 7 responsible for serving. Now, as to the Court of Appeals 8 or the Appellate Court which, I believe, Judge Adkins 9 was particularly concerned about and perhaps the motion 10 ought to be voted on separately for that reason because 11 12 the concepts are different: There is no danger, or there is no reason to 13

have this provision in as to the District or the Superior Court. It is taken care of under the trial court nominating commission set up. Now, as to the Appellate Courts Judge Adkins fears, and I assume some others from the sparsely populated counties, that they would be cut off from representation on these courts. I think their fears are completely unfounded. The experience of the Supreme Court of the United States, and there is no districting or
