to require districting and hobble the course of the nominating commissions from choosing throughout the State the outstanding lawyers to serve on the State's highest courts. Mrs. Bothe, it seems to me that THE CHAIRMAN: the subject matter here is one on which there is bound to be a divergence of views in this Commission and before the Convention. Therefore, this is one of those situations where it would be well for the Commission to propose alternatives. I wonder if you would be willing to consider amending your motion to provide that, with respect to Section 9-A, the Commission shall propose alternates and include in the draft the substance of your motion with what is in the present draft as an alternate? that fails, the Commission would turn around the other way. Do I make myself clear? MRS. BOTHE: You are not asking me to accept . THE CHAIRMAN: I am asking if you would change 18 your motion to that effect. 19 MRS. EOTHE: No, Mr. Eney, I think my own 20

feeling is that the Commission should take a vote on the
