8 add that I am not doing that here.

11 talking here about the third paragraph, I guess, the
12 Superior Court. I would move that it be so written so
13 that a man would be eligible for appointment to the Bench
14 both in the place where he resides and the place where
15 he regularly practices law.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: You limiting that to the Superior
17 Court or the Superior and District Court?

18 MR. CASE: Well, I think it is most appropriate
19 in the Superior Court area, and I would limit it to that.
