2 Judge Prescott testified or let his views be
3 known before the Committee that he thought this was a
4 very important thing and because of the fact that nobody
5 is excluded in the Appellate Court whereas somebody might
6 be in the trial court, I think there is a very fundamen-
7 tal distinction, and we ought to stick to the residence
8 requirement which we had.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

10 MR. CASE: I must say, Mr. Chairman, that there
11 is one difference as Mr. Sykes points out. The question of
12 where you are known and what you know centers on where
13 you are known and what you know with regard to the prac-
14 tice of your profession, not where you are known individ-
15 ually or socially, and every argument that can be mar-
16 shalled in favor of the vote that has just been taken, it
17 seems to me is equally applicable here. I know one
18 instance where a governor had in mind appointing the man
19 who lived outside of Baltimore City, and the question
20 was would he move back, and this particular person didn't
