Article 35 of the declaration of rights reads that no person shall hold at the same time more than one office of trust created by the constitution and laws of this state nor shall any person in public trust receive any -- et cetera. It exempts the notary public.

I don't know whether there are any changes in mind by the Committee handling this particular one. We feel that whatever is done ought to be done by them rather than by us. Therefore, this ought to go out of the specific area of Article 3.

THE CHAIRMAN: May I ask you a question. Your don't think there is any possibility that there should be desirability for not having a member of the Legislature hold office under the Executive Department without a general provision?

DR. BARD: Yes, we feel that this is the subject that should be left to the Legislature itself.
