I would like to inquire if the Committee would feel the problem would be solved if the sentence were, a non-judiciary member may not hold any office of profit or office of a political party while a member of a commission, and strike the rest of the sentence and substitute the language, substitute after and; and shall hold no judicial office for six months thereafter. My point yesterday was it would be very hard to get anybody on this commission for six months after resigning cannot be appointed by the Governor for an office, or couldn't run for an office. I just don't know who would do that, but I presume that the point is, we don't want them nominaring themselves.

MR. MARTINEAU: There is one other aspect to it. First of all, let me say this prohibition is included in the Constitution of other States, that of this type of commission, and I have heard of no difficulty of getting people to serve on these commissions. As a matter of fact, most of them have a longer prohibition after they resign as a member of the commission. But secondly, in addition to your problem of resigning and then being
