appointed to the Bench, it seems to me there is also a problem of their resigning and being appointed to another political office, or public office, and then having someone else appointed to the commission so that he can reflect the Governor's views or something like that.

In other words, be put on the commission to sponsor someone whom someone else might want to get on. This is one of the difficulties which we are trying to prevent.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miller?

MR. MILLER: Just a question. Would the language here, public office, profit, apply merely to State public offices or suppose, as might happen in some occasion, that the national administration called on semebody to be an ambassador or a commissioner under the Federal Rules, would be prevented from taking such a position because he had agreed to serve on a nominating committee?

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Martineau?
