Court and each judge of the Appellate Court shall be sub-1 ject to approval or rejection by the electorate throughout 2 the State. Each judge of the Superior Court and of the 3 District Court shall be subject to approval or rejection 4 by the electorate of the county or district in which he 5 was required to reside when appointed. Provision shall be made by Rule for the taking of a poll of the lawyers 7 in the area in which the judge is required to stend for В election as to whether he should be retained in office for 9 a full or additional term and for publication of the 10 results thereof. In the event of the rejection of any 11 judge by the electorate, the office shall be vacant. 12 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Martineau, is the reference 13 to Rule in the next to the last sentence intended as in 14 the previous Section to mean a Rule not subject to change 15 by the Legislature? 16 That is correct.
