THE CHAIRMAN: I am afraid we may fall between the forces here and each Committee think the other is governing.

DR. BURDETTE: It should be in the constitution on a matter of principle, at some place in the constitution, on the ground that we dealt with before that people should not be judges in their own cause. If we let this go to the Legislature then, of course, if they say we in the Legislature can hold certain offices, people will bitterly criticize them even if it is good public policy. If they do the contrary, they will be strongly tempted not to.

What I am afraid of is if we don't have it somewhere, we elect members of the Legislature to get their votes for something some Governor will appoint them to other offices so they will be more comfortable financially and we will be in a very embarrassing situation. I think there ought to be somewhere in the constitution that people do not hold two offices and it ought not to be for them to decide.
