2 the job becomes vacant as such; and where a person would
3 be appointed for an interim term when that term came up
4 for election, it would be open for those people who
5 felt the population wanted to be in that particular posi-
6 tion. So I support the amendment that this should be open
7 for amendment.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? Mr. Case?

9 MR. CASE: Mr. Chairman, I have given this matter
10 a lot of thought. I am not going to say what you think
11 I am, Bob, but I think there is a great deal of force
12 in what Mr. Della says. Of all the unpopular provisions
13 which have ever come to Annapolis in my judgement, the
14 so-called Niles Plan is and was the most unpopular with
15 the people who were there at that time. This is not to say
16 it is not a good plan. As I say, after giving it a lot
17 of thought, I have come to the conclusion it is myself,
18 for what that is worth. But I do think that what Mr. Della
19 says should not be dismissed lightly, and I therefore
20 would suggest, Mr. Chairman, and I don't know whether it
21 takes a motion to do this or not, that just as we had in
