2 true that the Congress may quarrel about this, but I don't  
3 think it is one of those things where I suppose we have  
4 to look on these alternate plans in detail, but I wouldn't  
5 even want to have an alternate plan put in about this if  
6 the majority of this Commission decides that we want to go  
7 along with the present framework that has been built up  
8 so carefully.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Gentry?

10 MR. GENTRY: Sometimes the choice of words is  
11 inadvertent and sometimes it tells a lot and thinking  
12 back to the form of the motion, I don't mean this in any  
13 way critical of Mr. Della, but his words were that these  
14 jobs should be given to the voters. Now, we aren't talk-  
15 ing about jobs. We are talking about elevating the  
16 Judiciary to a stature which should be above the usual  
17 run of the mill political jobs, and it is not the type of  
18 thing which lends itself to an election, and I feel strong-  
19 ly that we should keep it in the form we have it.
