2 submission only if the Convention requires it be drawn up.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: I don't know how that would work.

4 MR. SAYRE: I am trying to get this prepared.

5 MR. CLAGETT: I can't quite see the consistency
6 of what you have said when the vote taken was just 19 to
7 3. That means, as Mr. Case says, that the 19 have very
8 strong feelings and that is true but at the same time,
9 since the vote was as it was, it was clearly indicative that
10 we don't regard it important enough to come up with some
11 alternate.

12 MR. BOND: I disagree with Mr. Clagett. I
13 voted in favor of the motion. I am in favor of the Niles
14 Plan, but I am also in favor of giving the Convention an
15 alternative. There is a substantial group of public
16 opinion that is in opposition to the Niles Plan and I
17 think we are derelict in our duties in not sending forward
18 an alternative draft.

19 MRS. FREEDLANDER: As long as the substantial
20 body of opinion is not in this room, I don't think we
21 should be concerned with it because an alternative proposal
