than at age thirty. I would like us to really discuss 3. 2 this issue. MR. RUSSELL: The Committee considered all 3 these arguments for lowering the voting age and found 4 any decision to be made would be arbitrary to many 5 groups. In light of any overwhelming reason to change 6 we unanimously voted to leave it at twenty-one. 7 the traditional argument is offered if you are old 8 enough to fight, you are old enough to wote, the 9 logic of this was completely destroyed in the public 10 hearing of the Committee. But the degree of maturity, 1.1 of course, depends on each individual. Many people at 12 forty haven't reached a stage of maturity that many of 13 us would believe they would be qualified to vote. 14 There must be some cutoff. We saw no reason to change 15 16 from twenty-one. Any further discussion? THE CHATRIAGE 17. MR. MILLER: Question. 18 THE CHAIRMAN: A vote age is a vote in favor 19 of reducing the voting age to age nineteen. Those in
