

1 chief justice?

2 THE CHAIRMAN: The answer is No, and the matter
3 has been fully discussed, Mr. Mitchell.

4 MR. MARTINEAU: There is this answer to it:
5 The Supreme Court could, under the removal power, remove
6 the chief justice which is perhaps the ultimate authority,
7 and of course, the same power now exists under our present
8 Constitution, and I don't think it has ever occurred to any
9 chief judge of the Court of Appeals to engage in such a
10 maneuver.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: That concludes the consideration
12 of the Fourth Report of the Committee on Judiciary
13 Department. In view of our time limitations, we have ar-
