

1 stated fully its views in the memorandum which it cir-
2 cularized to the Commission and which I assume all of you
3 have read. It would seem to me, therefore, in the interest
4 of saving time, we could do two things. First, this is
5 one of those cases where with respect to these three
6 Sections, we could well include alternates and therefore
7 include either in the recommended draft or in the notes
8 each of the versions of Sections 1, 2, and 3.

9 I would, therefore, propose to you that without
10 further debate unless anyone feels that the matter must be
11 debated, that we take votes on each of the three Sections
12 as to which draft shall be the preferred draft to be
13 included in the Report, in which event the other draft of the
14 same Section will be included in the Report as an alternate.
15 As I indicated yesterday, this procedure is agreeable to
16 Mr. Case, who was the principal responsible man for those
17 favoring the language of the existing Declaration and to
18 Mr. Gentry who is the Chairman of the Committee. Is there
19 any objection to that procedure?
