MR. MILES: This doesn't mean, as I understand it, he has been an eligible voter for six months but merely a resident?

MR. RUSSELL: Resident and otherwise qualified and limited to presidential elections.

THE CHAIRMAN: Further discussion? Ready for the question? All those in favor of this section as drafted signify by saying aye, contrary, no. Ayes seem to have it. The ayes have it. So ordered.

MR. RUSSELL: On Page 5, Section 3, Residents of Federal Government Reservations. No person shall be deemed ineligible to vote in national or State elections solely by reason of the fact that he resides on land over which the United States Covernment exercises exclusive jurisdiction.

as to whether the term exclusive jurisdiction was proper and the Committee looked it up and found that Mr. Gentry, when he was Assistant Attorney General, wrote the opinion which deems this is the proper language. I think Mr. Martineau raised that. I was certain to have Mr. Gentry

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
