

1 THE CHAIRMAN: What is the language then,
2 Every person shall have the right to worship or not to wor-
3 ship?

4 DR. BARD: I just want to state very strongly that
5 I favor an affirmative way of making this clear, Every
6 man shall have the right, not, No person shall be res-
7 tricted. I think there is a major difference.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? Are
9 you ready for the question? The question arises on amend-
10 ing the Committee draft to delete the first clause read-
11 ing, No person shall be restricted in the free exercise of
12 religious profession and worship, and substituting there-
13 for the clause, Every person shall have the right to wor-
14 ship or not to worship as he thinks most acceptable. Those
15 in favor of the amendment, signify by saying Aye. Con-
16 trary, No.

17 The Ayes have it, and it is so ordered. The
18 ^{is} Committee draft/ now amended. The Committee draft as
19 amended reads, No law shall be enacted respecting the
