So that all such powers would end up as the responsibility ı of a single constituted regional government. 2 If such were presented in the Constitution, it 3 would not necessarily require the activation of any of 4 these regional governments until the persons involved 5 thought it required. This could be done and it could be 6 suggested that certain boundaries be studied and be pre-7 sented to a convention for consideration or inclusion 8 either in the Constitution or in the Supplement to the 9 Constitution. 10 This was one of the alternatives, I think, that 11. ought to be called to the Commission's attention, in that 12 it gets around the problem presented in the fourth sentence 13 of having a statewide referendum in situations that are 14 really not thought to be encompassed by the provision as 15 drafted. 16 THE CHAIRMAN: Any comment, Mr. Clagett? 17 In order for us to now go into the MR. CLAGETT: 18 provision for regional government, dormant or active, in 19 the Constitution, it would require a reconsideration of
