but the Legislature can't.

MR.CLAGGET: Yes, and I don't see where the local governments, when they agree to solve the problems, couldn't adopt the best means of solving it rather than the worst means, if I understand the question correctly. It would seem to me they would adopt the best means of doing so.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any fruther questions? Mr. Sayre?

MR. SAYRE: Elsewhere in this Article, it allows
the counties, if I'm not mistaken, to make any arrangements
that they wish and this particular paragraph has given me
more trouble than any other in the whole Article and again
to pose the problem, I would like to move, notwithstanding
any other provision of this Article --

THE CHAIRMAN: Before you make a motion, let's get the question, so we have the meaning of the paragraph and I'll come back to you. Any further questions as to Paragraph (c)? All right, then, I would recognize first Judge Adkins, who wanted to make a motion with reference to this paragraph.
