JUDGE ADKINS: Is the personnel appointed or elected?

MR. MARTINEAU: Appointed, and any sanitary district appointed in any county, they are appointed officials and they have the power to levy taxes to provide for the

JUDGE ADKINS: Is it generally true that the powers levied by sanitary districts are specified in amounts and limits?

MR. CLAGETT: They are based upon assessments and I think they are more accurately assessments. Now, if assessments are power to tax, then that would be true, but we're thinking in terms of power to tax, and the Suburban Sanitary Commission has the power of assessment on the basis of front footage and so on.

JUDGE ADKINS: That's different.
