3 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett?

4 MR. CLAGETT: Mr. Chairman, I think eliminating
5 the phrase, notwithstanding any other provisions of this
6 Article, would mean that the General Assembly could provide
7 intergovernmental authorities subject to the other res-
8 trictions, namely, general law, but I would like to make
9 sure that I do understand it that way. How does that read,
10 once again?

11 THE CHAIRMAN: The General Assembly may provide,
12 notwithstanding any other provisions of this Article, for
13 the creation of intergovernmental authorities. The
14 General Assembly may grant these authorities the power to
15 collect taxes and revenues imposed by the General Assembly.
16 That's the way the Section would read as amended.

17 MR. CLAGETT: We would not be in favor of that
18 because it does not impose any brake or restriction upon
19 the General Assembly to act.
