wherever the civil division may be contained within it 1 does not go ahead and do so. 2 I don't see where that is here, MRS. BOTHE: 3 unless the civil division happens to be an authority. 4 MR. CLAGETT: Well, the counties and cities and 5 other civil divisions which may be created are given the 6 broad grant of power and included in that would be the 7 power to tax, until and unless restricted by the General 8 Assembly. 9 THE CHAIRMAN: I take it that what Mr. Clagett 10 is saying, if I follow your question, Mrs. Bothe, is that 11 the first sentence of (b), saying that the General Assembly 12 shall provide by law for the government of the counties, 13 necessarily embraces, the requirement that it provide for 14 taxation, because you can't provide for government without 15 providing for taxation. 16 MR. CLAGETT: Exactly. 17 Any further question with THE CHAIRMAN: 18 reference to the motion?
