departs from past practice but did the Committee consider that?

MR. RUSSELL: No, we felt that is something people would tell the Legislature.

DR. BURDETTE: Also I am afraid under this language the Legislature could say well, the people in prison can vote.

MR. RUSSELL: If the Legislature so deemed proper, this is true. It is up to the Legislature to determine all these things and take into consideration all views expressed here. We could have stated simply persons convicted of crimes but serious was just put there to let the Legislature know that the framers of the constitution didn't intend this to be a trivial matter.

THE CHAIRMAN: We have to run the risk of

litigation in a number of areas. We defined our used terms in the constitution that can't have a precise and mathematically exact meeting. I don't believe

JUDGE ADKINS: This may be a matter for the

Committee on Style. Throughout this document we used
