2 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miller?

3 MR. MILLER: I would like to offer a suggestion.  
4 Maybe we could abbreviate some of this. I think the trouble  
5 that is disturbing some of us about this word soluble, I  
6 think anything is soluble and it would be a question if the  
7 word were changed to solved, past tense, solved; that would  
8 provide the protection and it would also not involve the  
9 question of what could be solved.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Do you accept the change or sug-  
11 gession, Mr. Sayre?

12 MR. SAYRE: It won't have any reference to that  
13 last phrase there.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: I don't think we have to debate  
15 it. Just do you accept it?

16 MR. SAYRE: I would not accept it, but could I  
17 make this statement? On the one hand, in the Article here  
18 we allow the local government to do everything and, on the  
19 other hand, on the motion we just made we allow the Legis-  
20 lature to have the authority to do the same thing and I  
21 think that's the way it should be.
