at the beginning, which is the clause beginning on the second line, except as limited by general law. The provision on Page 28 also has a clause, except as limited by general law, which applies to Paragraph (2), which is found in Paragraph (3) in the second sentence, but this limited by general law applies to the sharing of costs and responsibilities or functions. Whereas, the same clause where placed in (d) controlled whether or not these counties, cities and other civil divisions may agree at all or not to cooperate, which are entirely two different things, which I think probably destroys the significance

of having (d) at all in the Constitution, the provision

in (d). Plus I fail to see the reason for duplication of

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett?

MR. CLAGETT: The point is reasonably well taken because we are aware, as you point out, there is a duplication, but there is some difference and it is because of the difference that we've included it in both places. In Subsection (d), the provision is made for agreement or contract, as well as -- that is, with reference to functions
