MR. CLAGETT: I might point out, Mr. Chairman, that actually the First Report did include the consideration of intergovernmental relations and there was a recommendation made by the Committee which was approved by the Commission providing that the Constitution would include an Article providing for intergovernmental cooperation, except as limited by general law.

I think that by eliminating Subsection (d) and incorporating Article XII, somewhere either as a separate article, or in the first Article, we will have accomplished the purpose.

THE CHAIRMAN: Then we will consider Paragraph

(d) as eliminated. Do you want to go to a consideration

of XII now, since you are talking about that subject, or

do you want to reach it in due course?

MR. CLAGETT: I would rather reach it in due course, although I think we have largely considered it.

Let me retract. Let's do it now.
