general law? 1 MR. CLAGETT: When they change the law, the 2 advisability of it, as it would affect such a question or 3 4 situation. THE CHAIRMAN: Any further questions? Mr. Miller? 5 MR. MILLER: I don't quite understand Mr. 6 Clagett's answer. As I gather -- the question was what 7 would happen if a subdivision contracted with some foreign 8 interest and it was legal at the time, but it was something 9 the Legislature didn't want. Would it be binding? Wasn't 10 that the purport -- it might be, it seems to me --11. MR. CLAGETT: I think I can answer it more 12 specifically. If the General Assembly acted by general 13 law, the general law would then prevail. 14 MRS. BOTHE: In spite of any contractual arrange-15 ments made by the subdivisions? 16 MR. CLAGETT: It would have to. 17 MR. MILLER: If it's a contract, wouldn't it be 18 legal when it was made? 19 THE CHAIRMAN: I take it, what Mr. Clagett is 20 saying is that just as the Legislature could by general 21
