law take away or increase the power of political subdivisions, it could take away or decrease the power of an authority or a compact between political subdivisions.

MR. MILLER: But suppose a third party is in this some portion of Virginia or Pennsylvania. Would it be

Federally Constitutional for our Legislature to come along and change a contract that was made outside the borders of Maryland? That is my concern and I think Mrs. Bothe's concern.

THE CHAIRMAN: I would not think so, unless you could read into the contract the power of the Legislature to abrogate it and that might be possible, just as you have now in the Constitution the power to amend a corporate charter. Mr. Sykes?

MR. MILLER: So, the State might be bound by a contract it could not repudiate by the action of a foreign agency.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sykes?
