an intergovernmental authority, or at least there is sufficient doubt in my mind. So there should be at least, it seems to me, some explicit provision to the extent in which intergovernmental authorities may contract, subject to approval. I would recommend, in view of the open-endedness of the questions raised by this Section, that the matter be passed now and the Committee be asked to take another look at it, in the light of the discussion, and come back with a redraft.

MR. CLAGETT: I might point out that the language as presently set forth here is substantially that contained in the model constitution and has been very carefully drafted. So that I don't think we could do very much by way of improving upon it.

I think the protection, insofar as a contract or agreement between a civil division and another unit outside of the State would be one of a Federal Constitutional law and again -- and probably would be subject to the limitation which is contained in Subparagraph (3), a limitation by general law insofar as the General Assembly is concerned
