2 careful draftsmanship that was there applied over a period,
3 by Dean Fordham's statements, some eighteen years, we
4 hesitated to change it, but I am of the impression, Mr.
5 Chairman, that as you restated it, the same meaning would
6 still be there.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: All right. Any further questions

9 MR. SYKES: I would like to know what this
10 second sentence means. Mrs. Kostritsky pointed out to me
11 comments of Judge Allen on that sentence in which he says,
12 I must, however, confess that the last sentence of this
13 Article is completely incomprehensible to me and I suggest
14 it is quite possible it will lead to extensive litigation.

15 I would like to be enlightened, and I know Judge
16 Allen would, too.

19 the broad grant of powers to the counties or local sub-
