2 MR. CLAGETT: Perfectly frankly, we would not,
3 because I think that the General Assembly can step in and
4 take care of this under its powers generally. So, I'm not
5 going to insist on that, although I have given you the
6 reason why it's in there.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: The motion goes beyond that, how-
8 ever.

9 MR. CLAGETT: Well, the motion, as I understand
10 it, is a very fundamental one. The motion is whether we
11 should have a broad power or a defined power by the Legis-
12 lature and I think that's where --

13 THE CHAIRMAN: The motion in effect would
14 direct you to redraft the provision so as to provide for
15 granted powers rather than reserved powers.

16 MR. CLAGETT: We would very strongly oppose
17 that, because that's exactly what we have debated on over
18 the past year and we have approached it from many points
19 of view. We attempted to do just that and we found it to
20 be impossible. It is in that area where the Fourth Report
21 dealt with the status quo as against the broad grant of
