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MR. RUSSELL: Yes, Mr. Chairman, we can take that under advisement. Leave it to the General Assembly to determine the standard or attempt to revise this.

MRS. BOTHE: If we are going to reconsider the section I would like them to consider Professor Burdette's suggestion that the restriction be only as to those serving sentences at the time they would otherwise be eligible to vote.

MR. RUSSELL: We did consider that in our Committee and came up with the idea that the entire matter should be left to the Legislature. If this is a proper standard let the Legislature pass the law rather than have it as a constitutional provision.

THE CHAIRMAN: If the Committee elects to stand on that.

MRS. BOTHE: I would move the opposite.

It could be debated at some length and if the Committee hasn't thoroughly considered it, I suggest they reconsider it but I feel the confusion as to that crimes people are convicted of and which ones involve amoral turpitude and when they should be able to regain if ever their.
