

1 She's asking only would you study the question and see
2 if you can come up with a meaningful sentence to prevent
3 that.

4 MR. CLAGETT: We'll keep on studying it, yes,
5 sir.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Would that satisfy you, Mrs.
7 Bothe?

8 MRS. BOTHE: If I can, I might make a motion
9 again.

10 MR. MILLER: Parliamentary query. Are we
11 adopting the first sentence, modified as it may be by a
12 subsequent report from the Committee? Is that what the
13 motion is?

14 THE CHAIRMAN: No, there is no motion before
15 us at the present time and therefore the status of it is
16 that the Section at the moment stands as it has been
17 amended heretofore, but that the Committee is going to re-
18 study the second sentence and endeavor to draft a meaning-
19 ful substitute.

20 DR. BARD: Well, is a motion in order to give
21 real substance and support to the Committee, in terms of
