2 that class must be eliminated and a new classification  
3 agreed upon. So that, no more than one classification  
4 shall be in existence at any one time.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Now, Mr. Clagett, I don't think  
6 you've answered the first question, and I would answer it,  
7 I think, by saying there is no connection between the first  
8 clause and the second clause in the second sentence, is  
9 that correct?

10 MR. CLAGETT: I thought I had covered that in  
11 the preface when I said actually I thought this was tenta-  
12 tive because we have not finalized --

13 THE CHAIRMAN: I mean just to answer his ques-  
14 tion, there is no connection between the two.

15 MR. CLAGETT: Your answer is correct.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Now, Dr. Templeton?

17 DR. TEMPLETON: Now, I just heard it said, may  
18 I state it outloud, if we can put a period after general  
19 law and strike out, Provided however, that, have that  
20 stricken and start a new sentence --

21 THE CHAIRMAN: That's the meaning, yes, sir.
