DR. TEMPLETON: Now, my question had to do with this matter of groupings, with no fewer than three counties in any one group and yet in the last sentence we speak about a grouping of counties -- one grouping in five or fewer counties.

THE CHAIRMAN: What he has said to you. Dr.

Templeton, is that the Legislature may not provide one grouping for one purpose and another grouping for another purpose at any one time, that if it provides a group of two, three, four or five counties for any purpose, that is the only kind of grouping it can make at that particular time.

DR. TEMPLETON: All right, thank you.

MR. SYKES: Is it contemplated that at any one time the Legislature will have a grouping which will include every county of the State in at least one class? Is that mandated or is it just possible?
